DIBBILE MEMORIAL LIBRARY TO HOUSE SRS MUSEUM



The Savannah River Site Museum is coming to Aiken. Long-standing Foundation plans and dreams are being translated into bricks and mortar. The Museum will occupy the former Dibble Memorial Library building at 224 Laurens Street in downtown Aiken.

The Dibble Building is owned by Aiken County and

has been occupied by Records Management offices since 1974. These offices were moved recently to the new County Administration Building and the Dibble Building will be converted to use as the Savannah River Site Museum. The new Museum will be owned by Aiken County and will be operated as an affiliate of the existing Aiken County Historical Museum.

The building will be maintained by the County and the SRS Heritage Foundation will raise the capital funds required to adapt the building for use as a museum and to create exhibits

for the new facility. For several months, the Foundation has been engaged in the five-year “Aiken Together” capital campaign to raise funds for the SRS Museum, the Railroad Museum and Visitors Center and the African-American Heritage Center. The Foundation share of the money raised by the “Aiken Together” campaign will be used to

adapt the Dibble building and to create exhibits. No federal tax money will be required for this project. Architectural and engineering design of building modifications required to adapt the building for museum use will begin in the near future, as soon as



adequate funding is available. Construction of the required building modifications and exhibits is expected to require several years. However, while fund-raising and construction are in progress, the building will be staffed by Foundation volunteers and will be open to the public with limited hours and exhibits.

The Dibble Memorial Library was named for Henry M. Dibble a prominent Aiken banker, agriculturalist and philanthropist, who had established a library on the fourth floor of his bank building during the 1880's. Mr. Dibble died in 1921 and his friends raised money to establish a library in his name. The building was designed by Murray Hoffman, a well-known New York architect and artist, and was built in 1926. The original library building features 14 foot ceilings, Palladian windows and a fireplace. A two-story addition increased total floor space to 3,700 square feet in 1952 when the Dibble Building was incorporated into the Aiken County Public Library. The Library moved to Banksia in 1974 and Aiken County has used the Dibble Building for Records Management and other activities since that time.

The Foundation office moved from the Chamber of Commerce Building to the Dibble Building August 1st and volunteers are working to prepare the building for its new role. An official ribbon-cutting will take place October 27th and a wine and cheese celebration for Foundation members is scheduled for November 1st.

Adaptation of the former Library for use as the SRS Museum will provide an exciting new venue in downtown Aiken to promote interest in science and technology for young people, inform local residents about the Site's impact on the area and promote heritage tourism. It corrects a long-standing inequity in that *Aiken has been the only community supporting a DOE site that does not have a museum or visitor center devoted to the site.*

Plan to come and see the building and initial exhibits and to share the excitement of a dream realized after 10 years.


